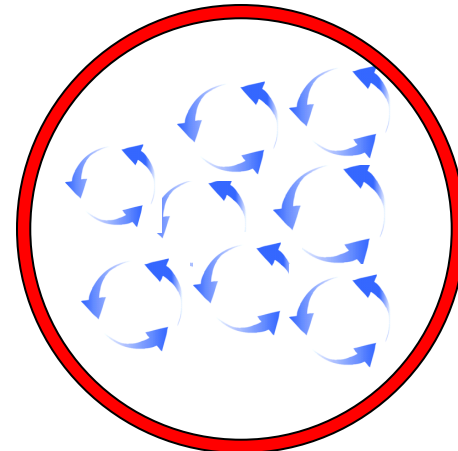

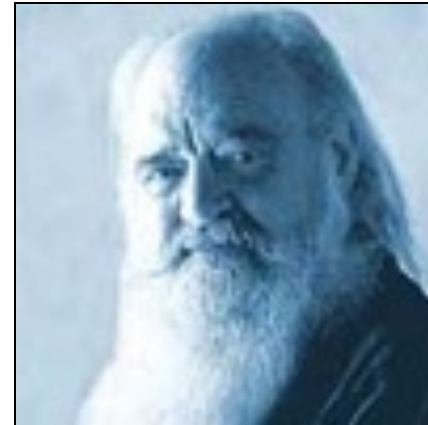

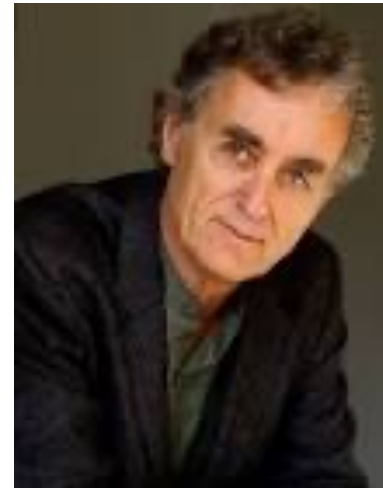

Myth is the way in which human societies give structure and meaning to experience.

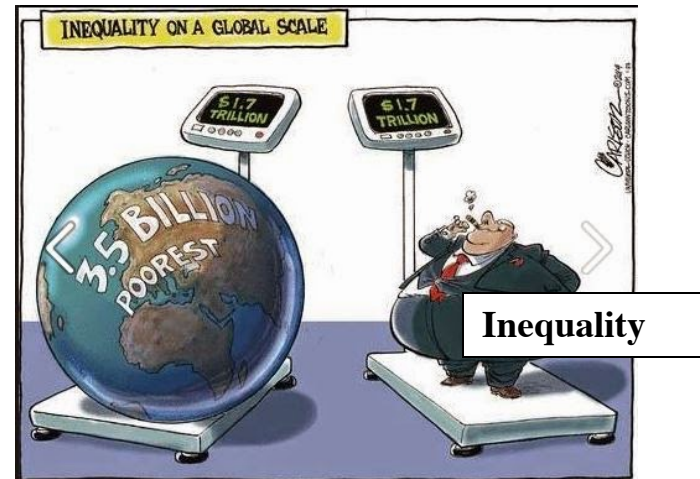
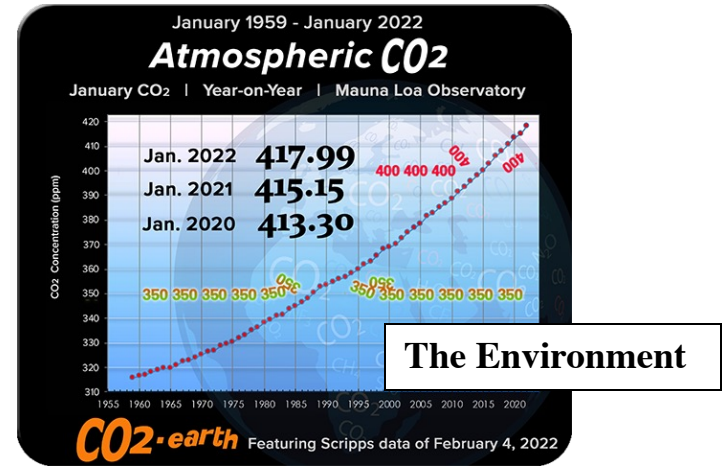
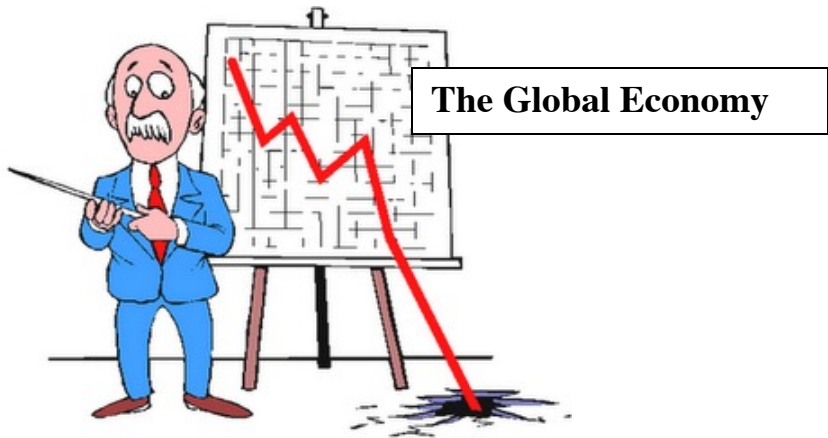
But the larger mythic structures of history we've been deploying for the last several centuries simply don't work any more.

Nature can be exploited

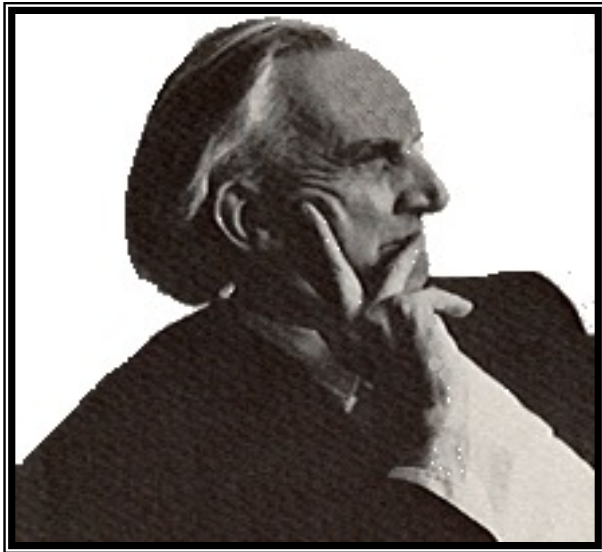
We are isolated

to disobey orders

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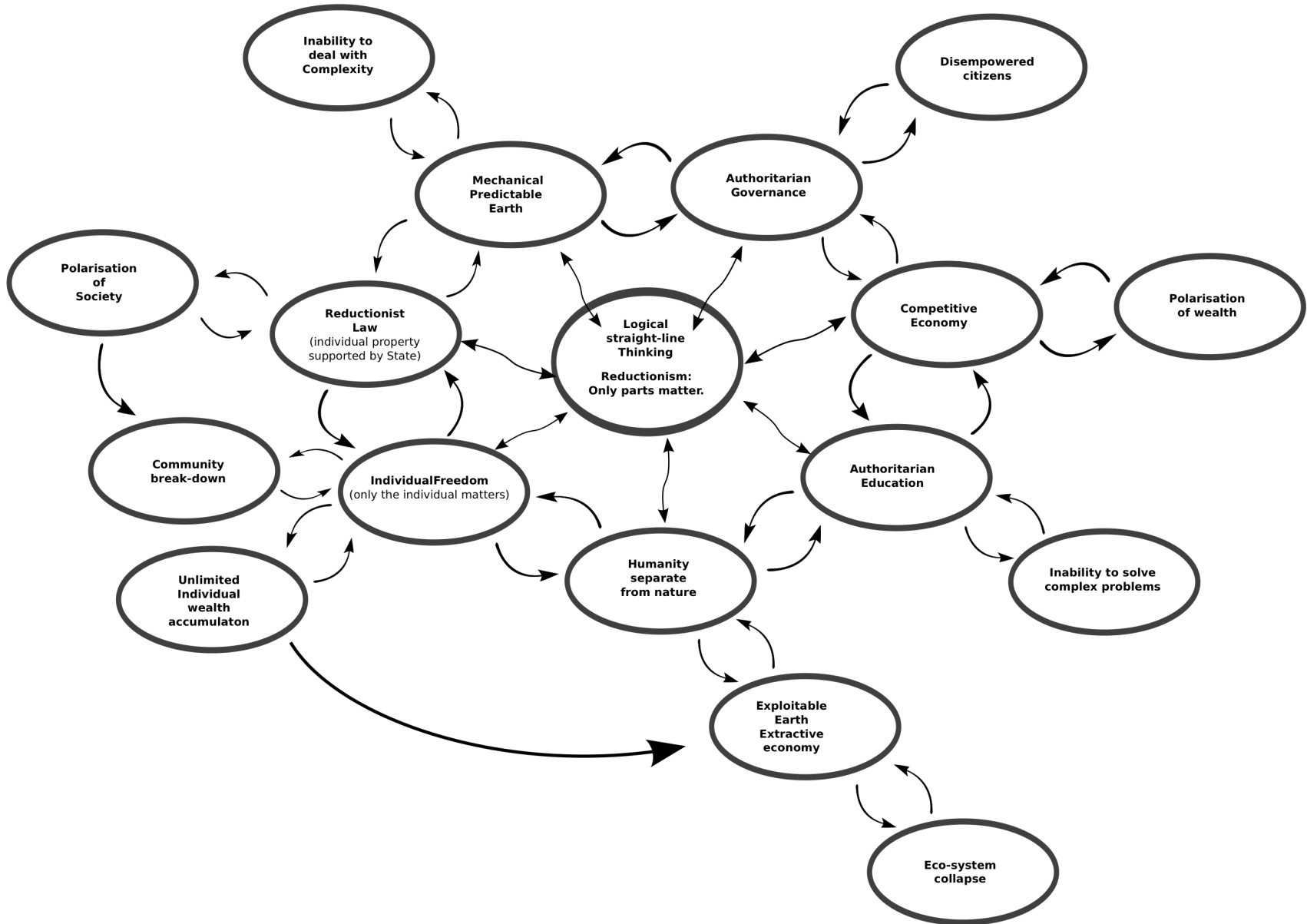
An Eco-system of Myths

An Eco-system of Myths

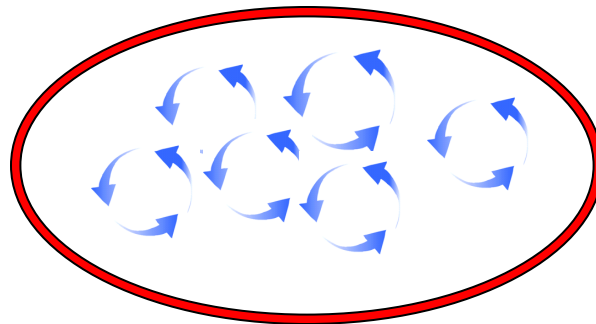
Possible Approaches
